Pre-arrival Information and Summer Task

Your summer research project involves creating an inspirational visual development of a lively on-going personal working research book. It should be an in-depth exploration of research that will underpin your first term of studies, so make sure it oozes inspiration, creativity and ambition... ensure you invest your time now before term begins! Try not to think of the end outcomes when you are only at the beginning.

It is all about research, ideation and exploration at this stage and making connections that may inform and link through the design process. There are no 'rights' or 'wrongs' for inclusion but the research should reflect who you are, you're interests, and be a snapshot of the environment that inspires you. If you have been uninspired at this stage don't panic! Find things you are interested in the main thing is to collect info for discussions. Designer's presentation is everything in this business. So please invest in a purposeful appropriate journal type quality plain cover preferably black sketch book in A4 size (no fancy or decorated covers) use like a journal or diary for your collated research, with good quality pages that you can work on either white or cream pages only, you may add different weights of graft, craft, tracing papers, adding coloured or textured papers to you pages to add interest and enhance the research story telling. However, keep it precious, organised and neat and lots of sketches and notes and visual images. Find the right type of book! ...it will be your one stop shop for references it will become your best friend next year, feeding your fashion design creative briefs. Please keep it organised and in a logical sequence. So, over the summer days ahead sketch sketch linking your ideas through your research book to your found research sources, so it reads like an exciting story telling visual documented journal full of information. You must assure the majority of your research is primary, showing evidence of rich visual communication through your mark making, drawing and designs.

Whilst we do not expect you to fill a sketchbook, we do expect to see a good body of quality research sources. This is your first chance to impress your tutors and peers so be honest, be brave, be creative be individual be you!

RESEARCH THEMES:

As humans, we are curious: we are driven to discover, to illuminate, to visualise and understand. This sense of inquiry is key to the design process – design demands creative thinking, and the constant drive to research, explore and feed a designer's creative imagination; So slow down. Tune in to where you are. Engage your eyes, your mind, your hands: observe, wonder, research, source, collect, draw. Put on your rose-tinted spectacles and begin a process of your own research inquiry and discovery.

You might choose;

- to explore inspirations deriving from physical elements of architecture, sculpture, nature, urban construction, art, graphics, music, street, films.
- to investigate how surfaces & materials are transformed distressed painted coatings, resins surfaces, fabric manipulations.

 to explore inspirations of visual and non-visual references, the designer's referenceinvestigating concepts-semantics, metaphors, icons, ambiguity, mythologies and visionary.

We really do celebrate the fact that you are all individuals and look forward to discussing your collated research to the above theme on your first week of teaching *Monday 23rd September* we actively encourage you to find your own designers `voice 'and make your mark. It's your mind, your life, your future, enjoy the challenge and create some magic!

INDUCTION WEEK PROJECT WHO ARE YOU?

As a fashion team, we are all very much looking forward to working with you and learning more about **you as a person**. In addition to your summer research book, which will inform the first module your second week ...we would like you to bring a meaningful object with you on your first day of induction week September 16th.

This inanimate object should represent you as an individual... reflect your personality, interests, hobbies etc. Keep asking yourself ... why have you selected this particular object? ... What does it signify about you?... How does it represent you? is it shape? the touch? the feel? the sound? the smell?...

PERSONAL VISUAL RESEARCH DATABASE

It is also very important that you keep up-to-date with what is going on in the fashion industry, so make sure you read newspapers (broadsheets not tabloids!), magazines and access fashion related websites too. Start gathering your personal creative interests, inspirations and passions, most creatives are 'magpies', so it is good to bring together inspirations and ideas from a range of sources. TECHNICAL FACILITIES

Teaching takes place in professional studios equipped with industrial machinery, dress stands, pattern cutting tables and Apple iMac equipped work station running Adobe Creative Suite. Digital design skills are part of the programme content, and the University has a provision of iMacs with Adobe Creative Suite installed for student use. However, many students prefer to have their own computers and increasingly they pay for the Adobe Creative Cloud on a monthly rental basis. Details of this can be found on the Adobe site and once enrolled at CSAD you will be able to enjoy student discounts.

PERSONAL EQUIPMENT

Fashion students need to be fully aware that when undertaking a fashion design degree, a certain investment is necessary in appropriate equipment. The following list is a good basis from which to begin your pattern drafting and clothing construction studies.

FASHION DESIGN TRIPS

Places of interest in Cardiff

Chapter

Chapter is an ambitious, multi-art form cultural space based in Cardiff, Wales that presents and produces international art, performance and film alongside a dynamic social space. Chapter is home to an independent cinema and a cafe/bar that is very popular with Cardiff's art and design community.

National Museum Cardiff

National Museum Cardiff (Amgueddfa Genedlaethol Caerdydd) is a museum and art gallery in Cardiff. Entry is free.

• G39

G39 is an artist-run gallery in the centre of Cardiff, Wales' capital city. The organisation recently relocated from a narrow three storey building where it originated, to an expansive warehouse. Here you can see a wide-ranging programme from major exhibitions and formal symposia to experimental projects and intimate events. In addition to the gallery programme. The organisation also runs Wales Artist Resource Programme – WARP - an open-access resource and training space for artists.

Craft in the Bay

Located opposite the Wales Millennium Centre, Craft in the Bay is an exhibition space for applied arts and crafts. It is operated by a charitable arts organisation, The Makers Guild in Wales.

Arcade Cardiff

Arcade Cardiff is a not for profit, artist led Community Interest Company established in 2011. They have a gallery / project space located in the Queens Arcade Shopping centre, right in the heart of Cardiff which provides a place for upcoming and established artists to experiment, test out ideas or show new work and get feedback as part of an ongoing idea or project. They also manage a set of artist studios.

<u>Tramshed</u>

Tramshed is a music and arts venue in Cardiff, Wales, located in a Grade II-listed building that was once the old tram depot for west Cardiff.

• Wales Millenium Centre

Wales Millennium Centre is Wales' home for the performing arts situated at the heart of Cardiff Bay and is one of the UK's top cultural attractions. The Centre provides an extensive programme of world class entertainment, showcases Welsh creativity and talents, partners with international artistic companies, and offers creative learning and community engagement opportunities aimed at increasing accessibility to art and culture.

Enrolment / Student MetCard Collection

Enrolment is an important process which confirms your status as a Student. You can complete the online self-enrolment process from any computer through our Self Service system. Please note that in order to self-enrol; your status must be Unconditional Firm (UF).

You will receive an email notifying you when you are eligible to enrol online. The email will direct you to a password reset facility in order to request a password to be able to login and complete the enrolment process. For information and guidance on this process please make sure you visit our enrolment page — www.cardiffmet.ac.uk/enrolment.

This process is essential in that it will allow you access to your student loan (if applied for), payment of fees, Cardiff Met's IT systems and importantly enable you to obtain your Student MetCard.

You will also receive your Programme Handbook during your Induction Week.

Enrolment for International Students from outside the EU

If you are an international student (from outside the EU) you **will not** be required to enrol online before arriving at Cardiff Met. This is because it is a legal requirement for the university to check immigration documents of international students before they are permitted to enrol onto their courses.
