Pre-arrival Information and Summer Task

So that we can get to know you a little better and that your class mates can too, we would like each of you to complete this short summer project during your holidays. You will be asked to present to your 1st year peers and tutors in the Graphic Communication studio on Tuesday 17 September 2019.

We would like you to hand in your outcomes on Monday 16 September 2019 when you arrive!

Me, Myself & I

We would like each of you to prepare a short 2-minute presentation about yourself!

We want to get to know you and want your peers in your group to get to know you too! The presentation could be a PDF, PowerPoint, Prezi (no more than 4 slides or it could be 4 pieces of paper / objects). It is completely up to you but we would like you to submit your presentations / outcomes on Monday 16 September so that we can format them before the presentation. Each of your individual slides/images should answer the following questions:

1. Who inspires you? This could be a designer, illustrator, photographer, artist, typographer etc. and tell us why they inspire you!
2. Tell us something interesting about yourself? What are you passionate about? Have you climbed Everest or do you love baking Battenberg cakes? We want to know more about you as an individual!
3. Why did you choose to study at Cardiff School of Art & Design? This could relate to why you want to study on the Graphic Communication course specifically or could visualise your career aspirations etc.
4. Show us a slide of your favourite piece of work that you've created so far and tell us why it is your favourite piece!

Each member of the Graphic Communication teaching team will also present so that you get to know us better! We are really looking forward to seeing your outcomes.

Reading & Equipment List – Graphic Communication

Any items compulsory to the programme needed in order for you to commence your studies will be provided to you, covered by your tuition fees. However, these items will be a shared resource and at peak times could be in high demand. We have taken a few enquiries from new students, asking for a list of things they could think about buying for their own personal use while they study. It might be worth looking at the list below and thinking about those things which, you would like to have for yourself, if you do not already possess them.

In general, many students like to have their own personal camera and laptop along with basic drawing materials, however, the list below is a guide for what else you may wish to purchase for your studies.

Materials

We recommend that you purchase a 10a Swann Morton scalpel handle (we will provide the blades), a 30cm steel ruler, a paper creaser/bone folder, sketchbook/notebook and pens/pencils which will consistently be useful to you.

Computers

We have resources for the delivery of introductory software classes. However, if you do not already own a high-spec laptop (Mac or PC), we strongly recommend that you purchase a laptop and appropriate software to maximise your learning opportunities with us. Our building has a wireless network available to students.

Computer Specification

We recommend the following as a minimum computer specification:

13-inch Apple MacBook Pro or equivalent PC

Software

Using the right software is ESSENTIAL. The software used on the programme focuses on Adobe Creative Cloud which includes InDesign, Photoshop, Illustrator & After Effects.. Membership of Adobe's Creative Cloud, allowing access to all of their latest creative software tools is available at a reduced monthly rate for students after enrolment at a discounted monthly fee.

If you make your purchases AFTER enrolment, you will qualify for substantial educational discounts.

- [Chapter](#)

Chapter is an ambitious, multi-art form cultural space based in Cardiff, Wales that presents and produces international art, performance and film alongside a dynamic social space. Chapter is home to an independent cinema and a cafe/bar that is very popular with Cardiff's art and design community.

- [National Museum Cardiff](#)

National Museum Cardiff (Amgueddfa Genedlaethol Caerdydd) is a museum and art gallery in Cardiff. Entry is free.

- [G39](#)

G39 is an artist-run gallery in the centre of Cardiff, Wales' capital city. The organisation recently relocated from a narrow three storey building where it originated, to an expansive warehouse. Here you can see a wide-ranging programme from major exhibitions and formal symposia to experimental projects and intimate events. In addition to the gallery programme. The organisation also runs Wales Artist Resource Programme – WARP - an open-access resource and training space for artists.

- [Craft in the Bay](#)

Located opposite the Wales Millennium Centre, Craft in the Bay is an exhibition space for applied arts and crafts. It is operated by a charitable arts organisation, The Makers Guild in Wales.

- [Arcade Cardiff](#)

Arcade Cardiff is a not for profit, artist led Community Interest Company established in 2011. They have a gallery / project space located in the Queens Arcade Shopping centre, right in the heart of Cardiff which provides a place for upcoming and established artists to experiment, test out ideas or show new work and get feedback as part of an ongoing idea or project. Enrolment / Student MetCard Collection

Enrolment is an important process which confirms your status as a Student. You can complete the online self-enrolment process from any computer through our Self Service system. Please note that in order to self-enrol; your status must be Unconditional Firm (UF).

You will receive an email notifying you when you are eligible to enrol online. The email will direct you to a password reset facility in order to request a password to be able to login and complete the enrolment process. For information and guidance on this process please make sure you visit our enrolment page – www.cardiffmet.ac.uk/enrolment.

This process is essential in that it will allow you access to your student loan (if applied for), payment of fees, Cardiff Met's IT systems and importantly enable you to obtain your Student MetCard.

You will also receive your Programme Handbook during your Induction Week.

Enrolment for International Students from outside the EU

If you are an international student (from outside the EU) you **will not** be required to enrol online before arriving at Cardiff Met. This is because it is a legal requirement for the university to check immigration documents of international students before they are permitted to enrol onto their courses.
