Cohort 3 Round 2 Call for Applications

As the project did not yet meet its staff targets as well as the overall set target after Cohort 3 Round 1, the Consortium has decided to launch a second round for applications (Cohort 3 Round 2) which was open to all eligible nationalities and restricted to staff level only. The call was planned to be open from 16th May 2016 till 30th June 2016. The Consortium conducted an extensive promotional campaign to attract a large number of applicants, including a telephone campaign to all past applicants and providing individual feedback to the applicants. However, despite of all efforts, we were not able to obtain the minimum number of applications by the 30th June deadline and therefore the call was extended until 6th October 2016. The call timeline was as follows:

Third Call for Applications – Cohort 3 Round 2	16/05/2016 – 06/10/2016 (144 days)
Eligibility check	By 17/10/2016
Assessment of Academic Quality	By 01/11/2016
Selection and Nomination	08/11/2016

Following the extended deadline, a record number of 172 staff applications was submitted. The Selection Committee met via Skype on 8th November 2016 and after a thorough selection process 23 staff scholars have been nominated for 1-3 months exchange mobility under EU METALIC II scheme. This call allowed the project to meet the staff and overall targets within the project's proposed thresholds.

We would like to extend our gratitude to our Partners for their hard work and cooperation during this Call.

Cohort 3 Round 1 Scholars

24 undergraduate scholars nominated under Cohort 3 Round 1 mobilised in August/September 2016 and they should complete their mobility by July 2017.

We wish Cohort 3 Round 1 scholars good luck with their studies!

European Commission Monitoring visit



The EU METALIC II Coordinators and our Moroccan partners, University Hassan II and SIST, had an opportunity to meet with representatives of the European Commission in Casablanca in October 2016 to discuss project's achievements, challenges and future plans. The meeting was very beneficial, the European Commission representatives had also an opportunity to meet current and past EU METALIC II scholars to share with them their EU METALIC II experience. We

thank the partners and scholars for their participation.

2nd Call for Scholarship Extensions

A second call for extension was open from 21st November 2016 to 4th December 2016 due to remaining budget available after Cohort 3 Round 2 nominations.

The Call was popular with scholars across all universities and we received 15 eligible applications. It showed good evidence of progression and academic merit to the proposed and a high number of scholars wished to expand or extend their research. The applications were assessed based on host university ranking, quality of the application and available budget.

We have awarded 9 extensions:

3 doctorates: 2 – 5 months extension 6 staff scholars: 1 – 2 months extension

We wish our scholars all the best and look forward to hearing of the results of their extended mobility!










EU METALIC II so far (without Morocco edition)

121 scholars have completed their mobility, 42 scholars are currently mobilised, 32 scholars are still due to mobilise and 4 scholars have completed the first part of their mobility and are still due to complete the second part. Below graphs outline the structure of nominated scholars per nationality and mobility level and compares number of nominated scholars to proposed number as per project proposal.









Based on the charts of proposed vs nominated scholars per mobility level and nationality the EU METALIC II project has successfully met the overall targets.

Shaimaa Alsaied from Graz University had an article accepted for publishing in the Journal of mathematical and computer modelling of dynamical systems.


