Erasmus study



Cardiff Met has over 100 European partner universities, where you can go and study for either your whole second undergraduate year or a semester of your second year, and come home carrying the credits you earned out there. 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Erasmus Traineeships

You can apply for Erasmus funding towards carrying out a work placement within Europe (paid or unpaid) that takes place up to a year after graduating. Aimee's Experience Volunteering in Fiji



Aimee Margetts, a 3rd year BSc Sport and Physical Education student, spent 6 weeks volunteering in Fiji last summer. This was partially funded by our GO Global Bursary, which any student can apply for. See her story below.

In July 2019, along with 25 other volunteers, I spent 6 weeks volunteering and living with a family in rural Fiji alongside the charity 'Think Pacific', whilst having the best experience of my life. Living in Naselai village was definitely the toughest yet most rewarding part of the project and was completely different to any of my expectations before leaving for Fiji. However, I was so grateful to live with another amazing volunteer and incredible family who welcomed us so warmly into their home.

As part of the project, we helped to teach in Nuku District school which I found so rewarding, and the small wins we were all achieving with our children kept our motivation and enthusiasm high throughout. In the school, we would have lessons in the morning where we would take the slower learners outside for 1 to 1 learning in English and Maths, and in the afternoon, we took different classes for sports (E.g. Netball, Rugby, Gaelic football, Zumba, Judo etc) which the children loved due to their extremely high energy, and the fact that they don't normally have sport as part of their school day.



Seeing how grateful the teachers of Nuku District school were for our help with the children made us realise not only the impact we had in Fiji, but also the impact this experience had on us. I was also proud of how much my confidence in leading lessons and sports sessions grew in such a short time and am now able to see how much this has helped me in my final year at University and understand how it will also help going forward.
